

Tales on the Trails: A new initiative combines storytelling and the outdoors

The Greater Sudbury Public Library, in partnership with Conservation Sudbury and Rainbow Routes Association, present a new initiative called **Tales on the Trails**. This Story Trail is for outdoor enthusiasts of all ages and families who are looking for a new way to experience the outdoors. A self-guided story time has been created for the 1 km Self-Guided Trail located at the Lake Laurentian Conservation Area. The trail will now feature a story written by Frank Glew, author and educator from Kitchener, Ontario. The story, called “Samuel’s Most Important Message”, features a special turtle with a message about taking care of our planet. As you wander along the trail, you can watch for the specially marked signs along the way to enjoy the selected story.

On **Wednesday, August 27** from **6 p.m. to 8 p.m.** the public is invited to join us to hike the new Story Trail (1 km hike) and hear the story of the special turtle, meet the author and participate in a special Turtle Talk by Dr. Jacqueline Litzgus, Professor of Biology and Sarah Woods from Junction Creek Stewardship Committee. This free event is open to people of all ages and we encourage you to bring the entire family to the **Nature Chalet** at **2309 South Bay Road** to join in!
